This is the second annual Certified Hazardous Materials Managers (CHMM) Springfield Environmental Summit. Last year we had approximately 100 attendees and 15 vendors at the Summit. We are anticipating at least 50% growth this year with attendance in the 150-200 person range and an increase in vendor representation. The target demographic for the conference is mid to large size industries in the Southwest Missouri region, although we are attempting to expand to the entire state of Missouri. The conference previously had representation from government, industry, consulting and academia.

The one-day conference will be held at the Doubletree Hotel in Springfield, Missouri on April 26, 2012 with a 3-day CHMM preparation course preceding the conference and a golf outing on the Friday following the conference (details below).

The conference is generally aimed at exploring emerging trends within the Missouri DNR, EPA and local municipalities that effect regional industry. For over 25 years the Institute of Hazardous Materials Management (IHMM), a not-for-profit organization founded in 1984, has been protecting the environment and the public's health, safety, and security through the administration of credentials recognizing professionals who have demonstrated a high level of knowledge, expertise, and excellence in the management of hazardous materials.

Over 15,000 homeland security, environmental protection, engineering, health sciences, transportation, and public safety professionals have earned IHMM's accredited Certified Hazardous Materials Manager (CHMM) credential. IHMM also administers the Certified Hazardous Materials Practitioner (CHMP) credential and the Hazardous Materials Manager-in-Training (HMMT) program.
