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Effective August 19, 2011

Special permits

REQUIREMENT for each applicant to identify their role as a SHIPPER (Offeror), CARRIER, or BOTH

49 CFR 107.105 – Application

49 CFR 107.107 – Application for party status

Any person **eligible** to apply for special permit may apply to be made party to an application or an existing special permit.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TABLE

- 49 CFR 172.102 SPECIAL PROVISIONS
- 176 (Deals with formaldehyde solutions)
- 177 (Gasoline, or ethanol and gasoline mixtures) Must be assigned a PG II regardless of variations in volatility



SHIPPING PAPERS and PACKAGES

- Companies shipping packages with the ORM-D consumer commodity marking can continue till December 31, 2013. Then packages **MUST** switch to the new limited quantity markings.



SHIPPING PAPERS

49 CFR 172.202(b)

UN1203, Gasoline,3, PG-II

The proper shipping name hazardous waste shall include the word “WASTE” preceding the proper shipping name of the hazardous material.

THINGS TO CHECK CONCERNING HWT'S

Are they carrying a current HWT license in their truck cab?



Has your transporter asked for information on your waste? Type? Source? Disposition?

How does your transporters equipment look? Is it a rented vehicle?



THINGS TO CHECK CONCERNING HWT'S



Are they knowledgeable about hazardous waste manifesting?

Are they licensed to carry your waste?



Are they showing up in a uniform? Name badge?



THINGS TO BE WARY OF FROM A HWT

If your HWT is giving you a incredible deal on your hazardous waste.

If your HWT does not want you to use a Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest.

If your HWT shows up with a horse trailer.



DIRTY TSDF's

Check what they can actually take from their home state DNR and EPA. Don't just accept a name from a TSDF or HWT. Find that home state's info and call them.

Check the TSDF officers names out on the web. Have they been in trouble before? Google their name.



USED OIL or WASTE WATER

Used oil includes, but is not limited to, petroleum-derived and synthetic oils which have been spilled into the environment or used for **lubrication/cutting oil**, **heat transfer**, hydraulic power, or insulation in dielectric transformers

1% oil added to 99% water and used in **lubrication /cutting oil, heat transfer**, is OIL.
